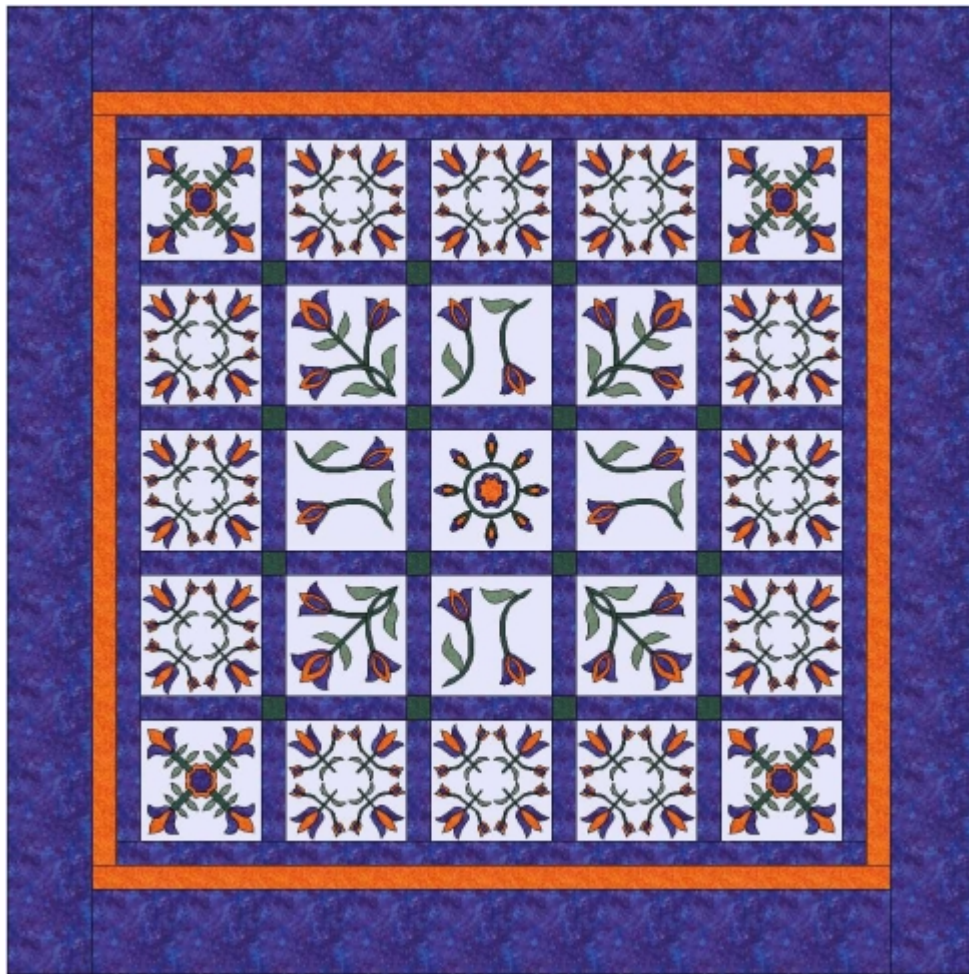

The estimate for this fabric assumes that long strips ARE pieced.

Please note that fabric estimates are based on AMAFU fabric which is 150 cm or 60 inches wide and that they are estimates derived from Eq7.

Cutting Instructions:

25 background squares 16 " X 16" to accomodate applique shrinkage

Sashing : 2.5 inch strips

1st Border : 2.5 inch strips

2nd Border : 2.5 inch strips

3rd Border: 7.5 inch strips

You will need 1 X Block No 5
 4 X Block No 4
 4 X Block No 3
 12 X Block No 2
 4 X Block No 1

Applique:

This quilt is designed for the use of fusibles.

There are a number of different ways of setting up guidelines for the placement of applique patches:

1. Put the assembled placement sheets on a lightbox- under your fabric as a guide, having ironed your base square into quarters and then diagonally to create crisp creases, to use as guides.
2. Do exactly the same as above but using a chalk pencil or a soap sliver and a ruler. DO NOT USE A WASHOUT PEN. The heat from the iron will set it forever.

Its HIGHLY recommended that you use an AMAFU † Teflon sheet when working with applique fusibles. It helps to keep your iron and ironing board clean.

Another way of assembling applique:

Lay out the teflon sheet ON TOP of the pattern sheets.

Peel the backing off your applique pieces and place in position on the teflon sheet.

Once you are pleased with the position of your pieces, , iron them directly onto the teflon sheet.

Move on and do section by section Peel off the completed sections as the sheet cools and place to one side.

Once all the sections are completed, position your pre-marked background square on the teflon sheet and lay down the sections of pre-assembled applique. When you are happy with the positioning, iron down.
